### Introduce New CPIN Faculty Member

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**Dr. Sylvain Moreno** As Lead Scientist of the Centre for Brain Fitness at the Rotman Research Institute, Dr. Moreno's research in cognitive neuroscience focuses on brain plasticity and its implications for neuroeducation. He is especially interested in how training and rehabilitation can affect higher order processes such as language and intelligence. To this point, he has studied musical training and bilingualism as experiences that depend on brain plasticity to modify cognitive networks. His research shows that these types of training influence processing related to attention, language, and intelligence. His research program incorporates multiple platforms including behavioural testing, electroencephalography (ERP), magnetoencephalography (MEG), functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI) and neuropsychological studies.
